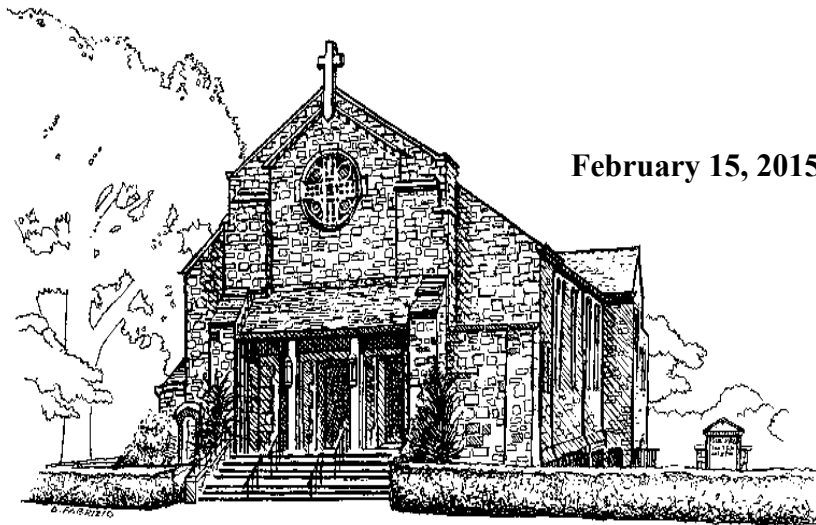

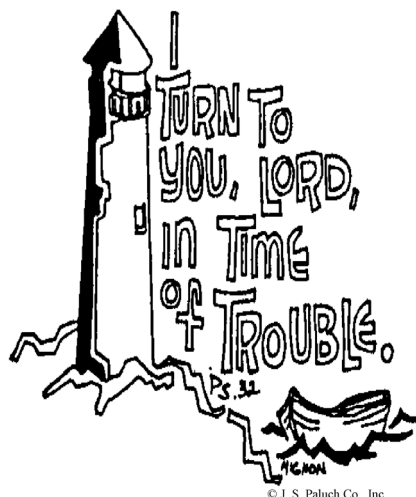

Why can't Catholics take Communion in Protestant churches?

Why can't I take Communion in a Protestant church? I agree with their belief that their Communion is merely a symbolic celebration. How does this go against church teaching?

According to canon law 844, “Catholic ministers administer the sacraments licitly to Catholic members of the Christian faithful alone, who likewise receive them licitly from Catholic ministers alone.”

The canon goes on to outline the exceptions to this rule: when “the danger of death is present or if, in the judgment of the diocesan bishop or conference of bishops, some other grave necessity urges it,” or for “members of Eastern churches which do not have full communion with the Catholic Church if they seek such on their own accord and are properly disposed.”

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that Eucharistic intercommunion with “ecclesial communities derived from the Reformation and separated from the Catholic church...is not possible” (1400).

The church encourages us to celebrate with our Protestant brothers and sisters; however, receiving Communion implies a unity that unfortunately does not exist. Therefore, as the Catechism says, we must pray for the return of “complete unity among all who believe in him” (1398).
