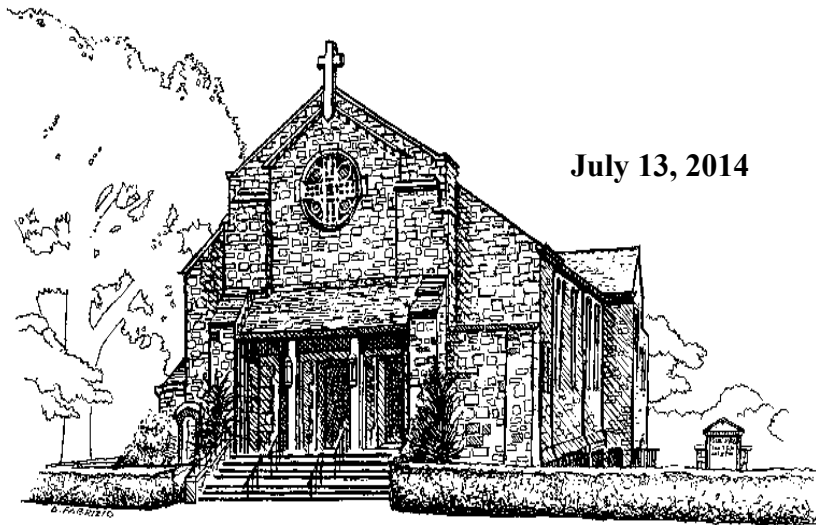

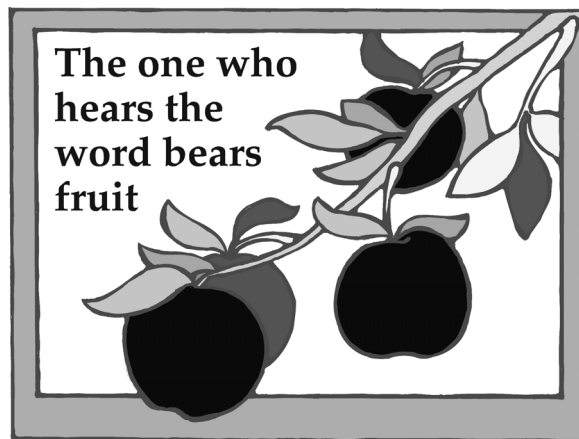

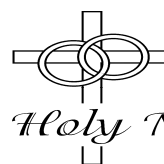

What is scrupulosity?

My brother goes to reconciliation at more than one parish so he can be sure he's getting the "right" penance. This isn't normal. What should I do?

It sounds as though your brother has scrupulosity, a condition characterized by obsessive thoughts about matters of faith. People with scrupulosity sometimes confess the same sin to several priests and compare answers.

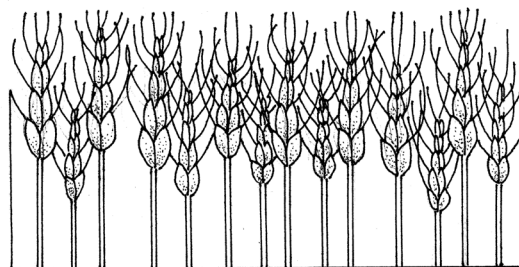
Living with scrupulosity is lonely and emotionally draining. The shame people with scrupulosity feel over their perceived sinfulness often isolates them from friends and family who can't understand their fears.

The treatment for scrupulosity is a combination of good pastoral care from one - and only one - priest as well as professional guidance, which often includes drug therapy. Researchers are studying scrupulosity's similarities to obsessive-compulsive disorder.

Another excellent source of support is Liguori Publications' free monthly newsletter, Scrupulous Anonymous, which is available at ScrupulousAnonymous.org. There you'll find links to other resources as well as information on retreats for people with scrupulosity.

If your brother asks for help, advise him to ask his pastor for the name of a priest in his diocese who specializes in scrupulosity, and tell him about Scrupulous Anonymous. Until then, continue to pray for him and be a loving compassionate sibling.
