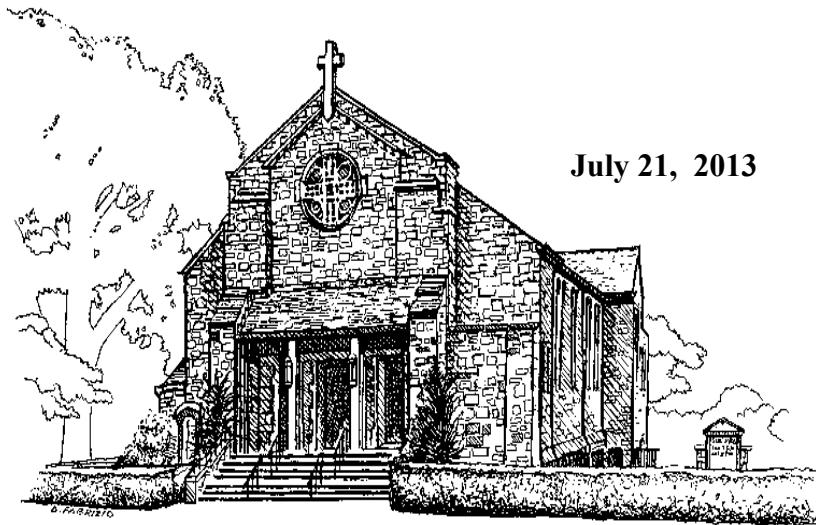

Why don't priests give the same answer?

A friend and I vacationed together. Her priest said she didn't have to go to Mass because we were traveling on Saturday and Sunday. My priest said I had to find a church. Why does this happen?

The Code of Canon Law says we must attend Mass on Sundays and other holy days of obligation (1245) and that “for a just cause and according to the prescripts of the diocesan bishop, a pastor can grant in individual cases a dispensation from the obligation” (1246). There is leeway, and we're called to follow our conscience.

That's why priests sometimes give different answers to the same question.

If someone says, “I'm going camping with my daughter this weekend the closest Catholic church is 50 miles away, and I won't have my own car,” I'd say it won't be a sin to miss Mass and that she should spend time in prayer Sunday morning. But if she says, “We're going to New York City and won't have time for Mass,” I'd say, “The Archdiocese of New York has more than 350 parishes. I'm sure you can find one.”

We're never on vacation from our faith. If you plan where you'll attend Mass just as you do the rest of your trip, you may discover a historic church, a widely recognized choir, or an award-winning homilist. But no matter where you go to Mass, you'll find Jesus, waiting to nourish you with his Word and feed you with his Body and Blood.
