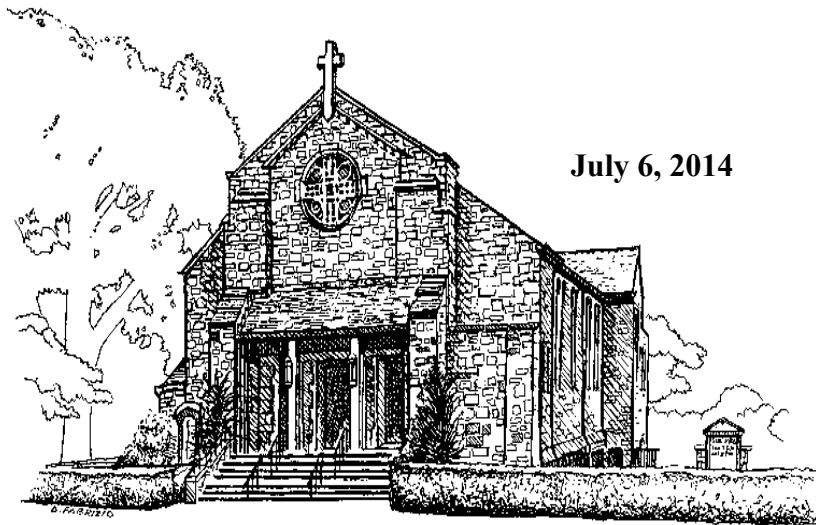

What is a quinceanera?

I have a Latina friend who is planning her daughter's quinceanera. It's as if she's planning a wedding. Please explain.

Quinceanera (keen-she-ahNYAIR-ah) is Spanish for "fifteen-year-old girl." It's also the word used for the Latin American celebration of a girl's entrance into young adulthood on her fifteenth birthday.

Some people compare it to an American Sweet 16 party, but because a religious ceremony is part of the celebration it's actually like a thirteen-year-old girl's bat mitzvah in the Jewish tradition.

A quinceanera usually begins with a rite called the Order for the Blessing on the Fifteenth Birthday (Bendicion al cmuplir quince anos), which can take place within or outside Mass. A party that resembles a wedding reception follows, so you make a good comparison when you say your friend seems to be planning a wedding. A quinceanera can also be like a wedding celebration in that some weddings get out of hand and become more of a production than a celebration of love.

That's not to say that parties aren't important. It's important to celebrate a wedding and to celebrate it well. In the same way, it's important in some cultures to celebrate a girl's fifteenth birthday. Your friend wants to give thanks to God for the life of her daughter, and that surely is a wonderful thing to celebrate.
