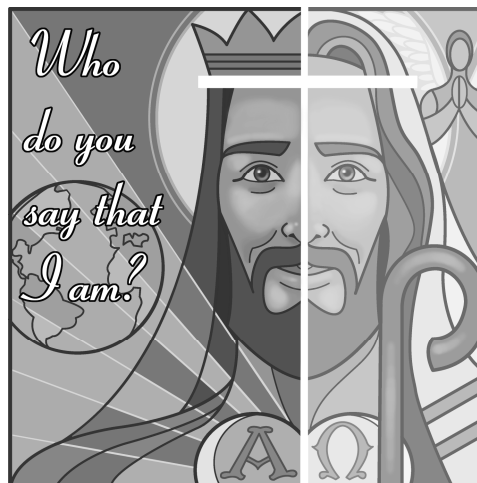

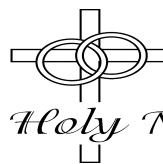

Why do Peter and Paul share a feast day?

This week is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Why doesn't each have his own feast day?

Actually, they do. Saints Peter and Paul are united in a solemnity on June 29 to honor their martyrdom, but each has his own feast: the Chair of Saint Peter (February 22) and the Conversion of Saint Paul (January 25).

Peter's primacy is evident in the prominence given to him by the Gospel writers and in the position of authority entrusted to him in the infant Church. Jesus promised Peter that he alone would be the foundation stone, keeper of the keys, and head shepherd (see Matthew 16:18 - 19 and John 21:15 - 17), and Peter oversaw Judas Iscariot's replacement (see Acts of the Apostles 1:15 - 16).

Paul holds a position of honor for his transformation from church persecutor to "a slave of Christ Jesus" (Romans 1:1).

Saint Augustine wrote that they share a solemnity because even though they didn't suffer on the same day, they suffered as one on different days of presumably the same year, 67, Peter was crucified and Paul beheaded.

Their esteem coupled them in the early Church's devotion. Hence, the solemnity Mass preface states that "each in a different way gathered together the one family of Christ; and revered together throughout the world, they share one Martyr's crown."
