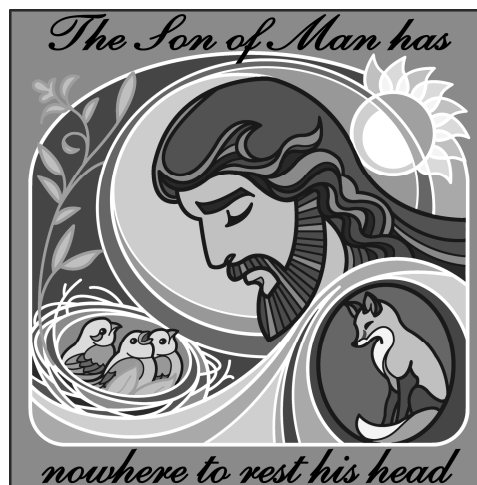

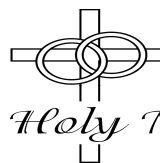

What does the Church teach about angels?

Where does Church teaching on angels come from? Where did we get their division into classes and the concept of the guardian angel?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that the existence of angels is “a truth of faith” known in both Scripture and Tradition (328). Here is an ancient definition: An angel is a mighty, concentrated personality standing in God’s presence, ready to do his bidding instantly.

Jesus famously speaks of what we take to be the guardian angels of children. He says the angels of these children always look on the face of God (see Matthew 18:10). Angels took care of Jesus (see Matthew 4:2).

The Church understands angels to be spirits. Angel means “messenger,” and angels are servants of God.

Different classes of angels are mentioned in the Bible (for example, Ephesians 1:21 and 3:10, Colossians 1:16, Revelation 11:16). We speak of Michael, Raphael, and Gabriel as archangels, because the jobs God gave them to do were so important.

The Church holds that Satan is a fallen angel (CCC 391). Jesus tells us Satan “was a murderer from the beginning and does not stand in truth, because there is no truth in him (John 8:44).
