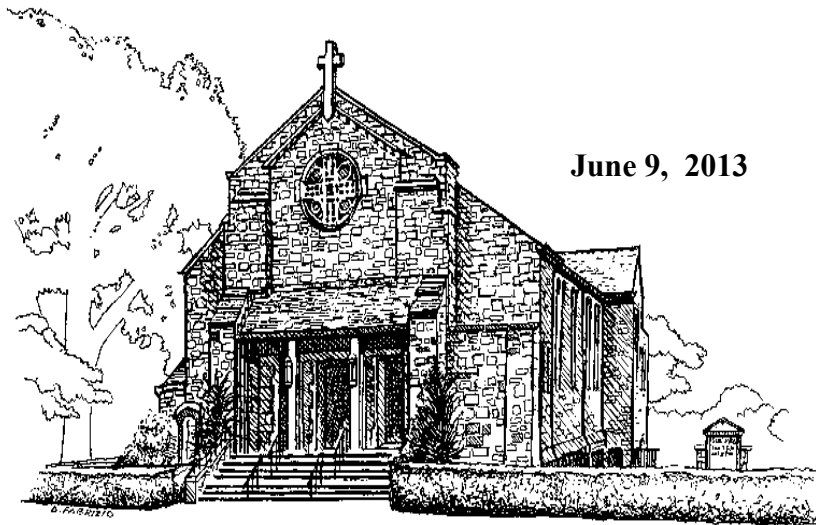

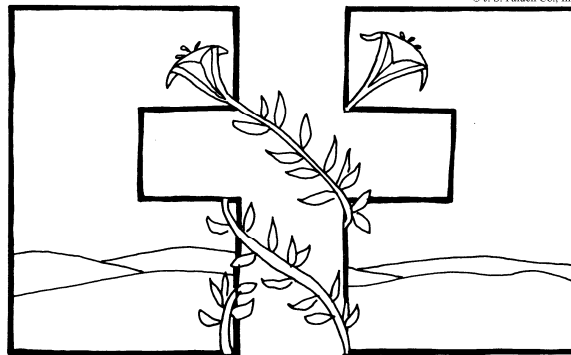

Is "limbo" still part of Church teaching?

Does the Church still teach that aborted or miscarried babies and babies who die before being baptized go to limbo rather than heaven or hell?

Although "Limbo" isn't official Church teaching, and it isn't mentioned in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, that doesn't mean limbo is something that's just made up.

The Catechism says, "Baptism is necessary for salvation for those to whom the Gospel has been proclaimed and who have had the possibility of asking for this sacrament. The Church does not know of any means other than Baptism that assures entry into eternal beatitude" (1257).

Current Church teaching on this subject is best expressed by The International Theological Commission's 2007 document *The Hope of Salvation For Infants Who Die Without Being Baptized*, which says, "There are theological and liturgical reasons to hope that infants who die without baptism may be saved and brought into eternal happiness, even if there is not an explicit teaching on this question found in Revelation. However, none of the considerations...may be used to negate the necessity of baptism, nor to delay the conferral of the sacrament. Rather, there are reasons to hope that God will save these infants precisely because it was not possible to do for them that what would have been most desirable - to baptize them in the faith of the Church and incorporate them visibly into the Body of Christ."

Please join us this Monday, June 10th for our ninth showing in the film series, "Catholicism - The Journey of a Lifetime, by Fr. Robert Barron.
