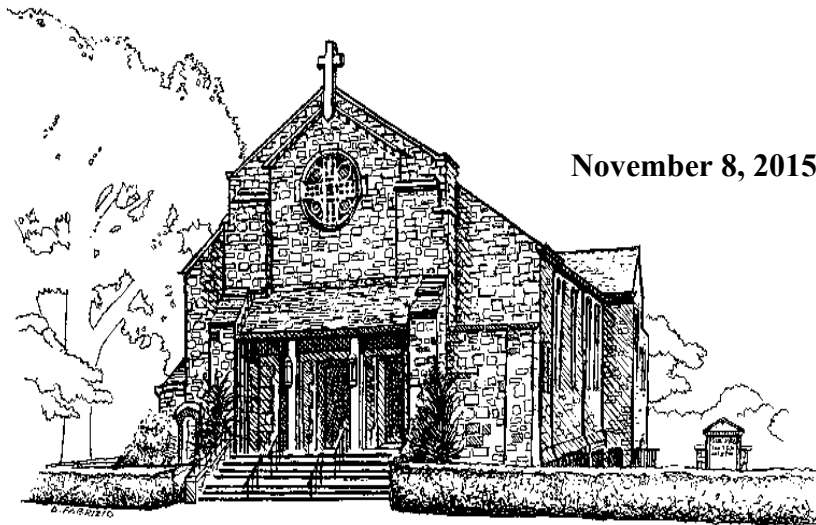

What does laicized mean?

What does it mean when a priest or permanent deacon is laicized? Is that the same as being excommunicated?

Short answer: They are not the same. Once a man is ordained a priest or permanent deacon, he remains that forever. Nothing and no one can change that. However, through laicization, the Vatican can release him from the obligation of exercising his sacramental responsibilities. If he celebrates a sacrament anyway, it is valid, but not legal in the eyes of the Church (licit).

A priest or deacon can be laicized voluntarily or involuntarily. Regardless, he is still a member of the Catholic Church and participates fully in its sacramental life. Excommunication, however, is a penalty in which a person - lay, religious, or ordained - is no longer in communion with the church or part of its hierarchy. He or she can no longer receive the Eucharist, but as a baptized Catholic (and child of God) may still attend Mass, pray for enlightenment, and seek to understand the truth of Catholic teaching. Excommunication is not a judgment made by the Vatican; it is automatic upon rejecting a fundamental doctrine of the church. One does not “get excommunicated; one excommunicates oneself. The Church may simply issue a statement stating that the person’s actions warranted this penalty if doing so will prevent or heal any existing scandal or benefit the public.
