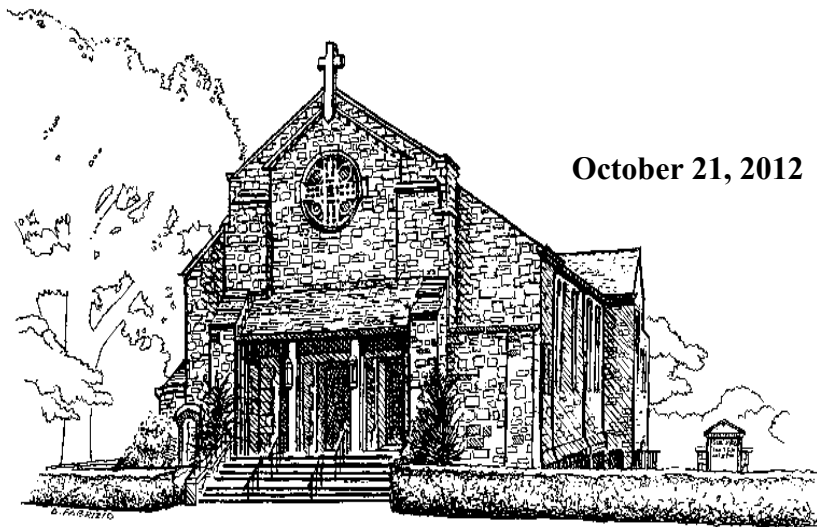

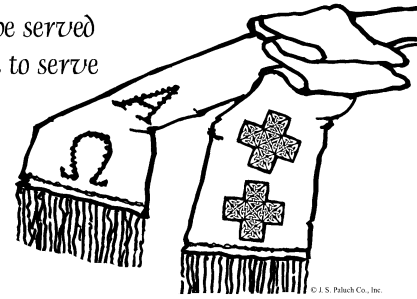

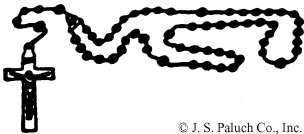

Does annulment mean my parents were never married?

Dear Padre,

I'm 15 years old. My parents were divorced last year, and they're getting an annulment. They told me this will mean that in the eyes of the Church, they were never married. Is that true? After their marriage is annulled, will the Church consider me to be born out of wedlock?

Dear JoAnne,

No. Annulment is not a declaration by the Church that a marriage didn't exist. It's a declaration that the marriage was never sacramental, which is different from saying it wasn't legal. Couples must get a civil divorce before they can apply for annulment, because annulment doesn't affect the legality of their marriage.

Catholics believe marriage is a sign of God's never ending love and faithfulness. Therefore, marriages are indissoluble; a marriage ends only when a spouse dies—unless the marriage wasn't sacramental, which is where the annulment comes in.

Contrary to popular belief, annulment is not a liturgical divorce. It's an investigation into a marriage to see whether it was sacramental. If the Church determines that something essential was missing from the marriage right from the start, it grants the annulment. The Church is saying that although the couple were legally married, they were not sacramentally married.

Your parents were legally married in the eyes of the state, so you were not born out of wedlock in either the states's or the Church's eyes.
