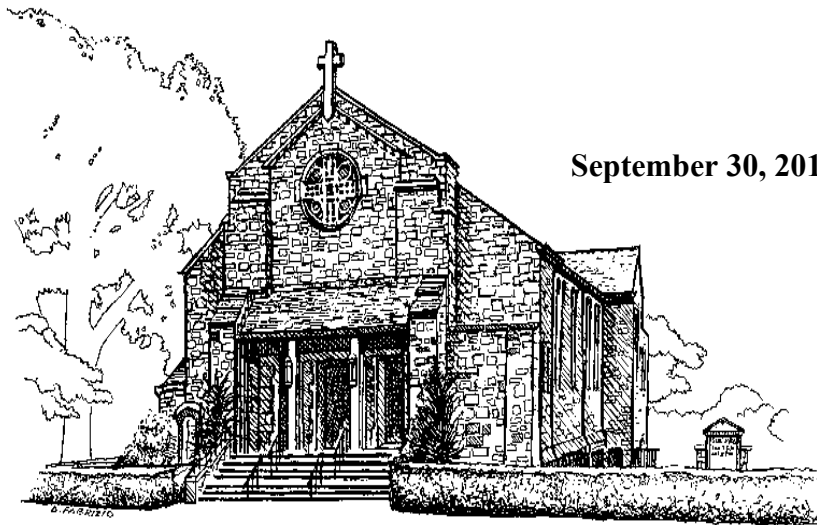

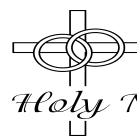

## Dear Padre September 30, 2018

The older I get, the more distracted I become by crying babies at Mass. Sometimes I leave Mass so irritated that I wonder what benefit is gained in going at all.

*At the movies, the opera, or some other formal live performance*, a crying infant is regarded as persona non grata. But the Eucharist is a family event, not a theatrical one. Children should feel welcomed at Mass. After all, Jesus said, “Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these” (Mark 10:14).

While small children may belong at Mass, it should also be acknowledged that certain courtesies apply when crowds gather to pray in the house of the Lord. Parents may consider sitting at the end of a pew for a quick exit to minimize disruption when a child needs immediate attention. When a child is of a certain age, parents may consider taking advantage of parish nurseries or designated cry rooms in churches on a temporary basis, if available.

By the same token, impatient parishioners (and preachers) should be sensitive to the needs of parents, who admirably desire participation in the family celebration and weekly nourishment by Christ’s word and sacrament - temporary toddler temper tantrums notwithstanding. “Be still and know that I am God!” (Psalm 46:11) is a divine invitation to worshipers of all ages.
